Week Seven Learning Project – Transport	
Weekly Reading Tasks	Weekly Phonics Tasks
Monday- Sing the nursery rhyme 'Wheels on the Bus' with your child. Can they add verses about different modes of transport? What sounds and actions do other kinds of transport make? Tuesday- Follow the story <u>The Bus is for Us</u> with your child. Ask them to recall the different types of transport mentioned in the story.	
Wednesday- Tell your child that they're going on an imaginary journey. What do they need to take? Play the memory game - 'I packed my bag and in it I put a' Take it in turns and keep adding to the list. Each time repeat the whole list.	Phase 4 – look at sounds mat intro a new <u>blending cluster</u> sound. **All groups to read words, make words and write words (blending and segmenting) containing the day's new sound Phase 2 – <u>letters and sounds</u> Phase 3 – phase 3 words
Thursday - Go on a walk discuss with your child the things they see. Ask them to note the different transports. When you get home, ask them to recount the events from your journey in order. Friday- Listen to 'The Naughty Bus'. Your child can make a wanted poster for the Naughty Bus.	Phase 2 — phase 2 words Phase 3 — phase 3 words Phase 4 — phase 4 words Extras *Play Buried Treasure - Write out some real words and made up words (e.g. tud, jup, fub). Place these in
	a pile and using 2 containers, label one as 'Treasure' and the other as 'Bin'. Can your child read the word and decide if it is real? If it is real it goes in the treasure chest, if not it goes in the bin. *Round the house - Ask your child to find things around the house that end (if applicable) with the sound they have been practicing today

Monday- Ask your child to draw pictures of/or cut out pictures from a magazine of different types of transport and label them. CHALLENGE: Sort them into water, air and road.	Weekly Maths Tasks – Sorting into Sets Monday- Select some toys and ask your child to pick one and describe it. Can they talk about it's colour, pattern, shape and size? Repeat this for a different toy. Afterwards, get them to compare the toys explaining similarities and differences.
Tuesday- Your child can make their own road safety poster - Stop, Look, Listen. Watch Road safety video	Tuesday- Put out a selection of toys/objects you have at home that are similar, e.g. cars, pens and pencils, pieces of fruit, pebbles etc. Thinking about what is the same and what is different, can your child sort them into 2 groups? Ask your child if the objects can be sorted into 2 groups in a different way. CHALLENGE: If your child can sort them into 2 groups, can they try and sort them into three groups?
Wednesday- watch The Train Ride for an Imaginary journey-where would your child go? Why would they go there? What would they do there? They could draw out their imaginary land and label it with describing words.	Wednesday- Sort objects that are similar to each other (look above for ideas) and sort them into groups yourself. Then, show your child the groups you have sorted them into. Can they decide how the objects have been sorted?
Thursday- Go on a walk, what did your child see and hear and hear on the walk? Can they write simple sentences about it? You could always take pictures to print out, stick down and label, to simplify the task.	Thursday - Explore weighing and measuring different objects on the kitchen scales. Ask, what happens as you place more on the scales?
Friday- Make your very own Naughty Bus and use this to retell the story.	Friday (theme)- Sit with your child and look out the window. Count how many vehicles they can see. Sort them in different ways such as: size, colour, etc.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about transport. Learning may focus on modes of transport, transport in the past, the science behind transport, road safety and how to be safe around water.

Make Paper Planes

• Make paper airplanes using this <u>guide</u>. Ask your child/ children to come up with a name for their airplane and write this on the side. Have a competition to see whose airplane will fly the furthest/ highest. You could ask them to create a certificate for the winner. Take a photograph of the winning plane to share your success and upload to Twitter at <u>#TheLearningProject</u>.

Traffic Lights

- Play the traffic light game- Ask your child to help create a set of traffic lights. This could be as <u>detailed</u> or simple as you like. Ask your child to run around the garden/ outdoor space. When you point to a colour on the traffic light they have to do the following:
 - o Red-Stop or freeze where they are
 - Orange- Walk slowly
 - o Green-Run

You can extend this by adding in different actions e.g. when you bounce a ball on the ground, they have to jump up and down.

Origami Boat

• Follow the instructions here to make your very own origami boat. You could float these in a paddling pool, in the sink or in the bath. Experiment with filling your boats up with objects, does it still float?

Follow the instructions -

- Give instructions to guide each other around the house/garden i.e. forward two steps, turn left, forward two more steps.
- Can you support your child in drawing a map to show the way around the house?



Roleplay

- Can you pretend to be getting on the bus/plane/train?
- Arrange chairs to mirror the seating on a plane. Can your child write a ticket? Will you have any food during your journey?
