Dear Parents and Carers, it was lovely to see so many of you this morning and especially nice to hear so many 'thank you Joan' to Joan, our Patrol. I did notice a few parents crossing further up the road from the crossing and Joan said that she's had a few follow her out into the road before she is sure that the traffic has stopped. I do understand that after a busy morning of trying to get your children to school, your main objective is to get them in to school on time, but if I could explain that we are there to 'be somewhere safe to cross' and by crossing away from the crossing, we are teaching our children a different message. Also, it is important that we wait to have the traffic under control before asking you to enter the road so if I could ask that you wait for Joan before stepping into the road, we will then achieve the safe crossing we aim to deliver.
